penetrating as this work. Raphael includes the effects of bereavement on children and the effects of the death of children on parents, both important topics which, turn, enlighten our understanding of other types of bereavement. The book by Osterweis et al is a multi-author volume which matches the Stroebes in scientific respects and, in addition, gives a more detailed account of services for the bereaved in the USA but it suffers from being written by a committee.

All in all, Wolfang and Margaret Stroebe are to be congratulated on writing an important text book which must be read and kept for reference by every serious student of bereavement.

#### THE PITCH OF GRIEF Video cassette US\$350. Fanlight Productions, 47 Halifax Street. Boston, Mass. 02130 USA.

This 28 minute video allows four articulate Americans to talk about their exprience of bereavement. A young widow, a young mother who has lost a child and an older widow and widower describe simply and directly what they went through, what directly what they went the helped and what did not help.

The accounts are inter-cut so that we follow the grieving process from its painful beginnings through to a very positive and encouraging outcome in all four cases. There is no attempt to explain or theorise but two hospice co-ordinators add their own comments. I particularly liked one of these: 'You can't lead somebody through grief, all you can do is to try to follow'.

Made by a journalist, Eric Stange, after the death of his wife, "Pitch of Grief" pro-vides a rich material suitable for any training programme for bereavement coun-

sellors. Several of the bereaved people have been helped by attending mutual-help groups and are able to explain how this came about.

My only doubts concern the overall impression given by the film that grief, though painful, is inevitably a beneficial experience. One of the speakers almost seems to be apologising for the fact that, however much she may have gained from her bereavement, she would still prefer to have her child back! This Pollyannish view may be encouraging to bereavement counsellors but should not lead them to imagine that every, or even most grief, will have a happy ending.

Despite the fact that all the participants in the film are Americans the implications

are universal and easily intelligible.
